

APPLICATION FORM FOR SAISI SI RELATED TRAINING COURSES 2018

- Applicants will receive CPD points for all courses as accredited by an appointed Accreditation Committee.
- A 25% deposit must accompany the application for a course. The deposit will be returned if the
 applicant is not accepted for the course due to a course being full, or if the applicant cancels
 before the deadline for applications. Cancellations after the closing date for applications will
 result in a charge of 25% of the course fee to be used for administration (you will lose your
 deposit).
- Cancellations one week, or later before commencement of the course will forfeit in 100% of the course fee, unless the applicant's place is filled – in that case only the 25% deposit will be held back
- If you do not meet the pre-requisites for a course, by for example not handing in your peer review, typical cases, atypical case, protocol etc., it is your responsibility to cancel your application. The 25% handling fee will apply if you cancel after the deadline for applications.
- If you have applied for more than one course and do not get accepted for the course first in line for the qualification process, or cancel for the first course in line, please cancel for the subsequent courses. You will lose your deposit if you cancel after the deadline for applications.
- There is a limit to the number of participants on each course. SAISI will not be liable for travelling and accommodation arrangements and fees if an applicant is not accepted on to a course.
- Insufficient participants to run a particular course could result in cancellation of the course. Applicants will
 however be notified. SAISI will not be liable for travel arrangements and accommodation that may have
 to be cancelled.
- Updated course information will be available on the SAISI website: www.instsi.co.za SAISI reserves the right to alter course requirements at any time during the training process to ensure quality training. Participants will be informed of this but it is the participant's responsibility to keep up to date with the latest information.
- All applications are processed online. Please log into <u>www.otadmin.co.za</u> and follow instructions mentioned on page 4 of this application form.
- Online registrations will not be possible after the closing date for application, except in the case where there is notification that the deadline date has been extended.
- We work on first come first served basis, once the application is received and the deposit paid.

- The basic training courses (Theory-, Test Administration-, Interpretation- and intervention Course) must be attended in the order as set out above and the applicant must comply with certain pre-requisites before attending each course. Please enquire at the OT office/website regarding the pre-requisites or find the document *Course Structure* on the website. Applicants must ensure that they are eligible for the course that they are applying for.
- Do not apply for all four courses in the same year as one cannot attend the Interpretation and Intervention Course in the same year.
- Do not wait to apply for the Intervention Course until you have heard that you have passed the protocol. Note the deadline for applications.
- If you have been on a waiting list due to not getting a place on any course before 2018 (even if you did meet the deadline and adhered to the pre-requisites), you still have to re-apply for the specific 2018 course before the deadline for applications.
- There is a time frame of 5 years in which to complete all the courses and requirements. You need to contact SAISI to apply for an extension if you will not be able to stay within this time frame. You need to motivate the request for extension well and it will not be automatically granted, but is up to the discretion of the Board.
- All contact hours must be attended on a course.
- Most venues only cater for standard- or vegetarian food. The fee per head includes the food and drinks
 and if a participant has other dietary preferences and brings her own food, the venue will not give discount
 and will bill the whole fee. Unfortunately SAISI can thus not refund for food not eaten as provided by the
 venue.

COURSE STRUCTURE OF THE "SIPT AND AYRES SENSORY INTEGRATION® QUALIFICATION" COURSES PRESENTED BY SAISI

There are four intensive consecutive courses that consist of:

THEORY COURSE:

This course is designed to help the participant become conversant in theory and research related to Ayres Sensory Integration® (ASI). The relationship of ASI to neurobiological principles and occupation is discussed. Emphasis is placed on typical development first before looking at atypical patterns of development. Participants are taught the administration of the Clinical Observations (SAISI) as adapted from Jean Ayres. Participants are sent a pre-course package (including a pre-course quiz, glossary of terminology, recommended reading and reference materials) to gain familiarity with the theory of SI and the Clinical Observations.

Assessment following course work: A post course questionnaire must be completed and passed, following the Theory course (within the set time frame as given on the Theory Course), in order to be eligible for a Test Interpretation course. The questionnaire must be completed by participants in the same year that the course was attended.

TEST ADMINISTRATION COURSE:

This course is designed to provide in-depth information and teaching of the process of evaluating sensory integration and praxis. The Sensory Integration and Praxis Tests (SIPT) are presented as the gold standard in evaluating SI. The administration of the SIPT is the primary focus of this course. The holistic process of assessment and evaluation of sensory integrative functioning is explained. Participants must purchase a SIPT scoring pack and a bring a SIPT manual and together with a SIPT test kit to the course (the manual and kit may be borrowed).

Assessment following course work: Following the course, participants need to complete a peer review, test 4 typically developing children and one child with suspected SI difficulties (atypical case). These requirements need to be submitted to SAISI within the allocated timeframe in order to be eligible to attend the Test Interpretation Course.

TEST INTERPRETATION COURSE:

This course focuses on: the interpretation of sensory integration, using clinical reasoning, interpreting the results of the SIPT and interpreting structured and unstructured clinical observations, play and therapy. Clinical pictures of sensory integration dysfunctions are taught.

For the purpose of interpretation of an atypical case, participants must bring the following with them to the course: **WPS** report, Ayres & GM clinical observations, sensory assessments and any other tests done, as well as any other relevant information and a 5 minute DVD of their atypical case in an unstructured situation. The participants also need to bring the SIPT manual and clinical observations booklets to the course. Participants are expected to go through the course notes of the first two courses. A pre-course questionnaire will have to be submitted electronically one week before commencement of the course.

Assessment following coursework: Following this course the participants are required to submit a case and write up a protocol showing their clinical reasoning of interpretation. This process includes the marking of their SIPT administration before starting the protocol, as well as attending at least one mentoring session. This protocol needs to be passed before being able to attend the Intervention course.

INTERVENTION COURSE:

On this course the intervention strategies within the Ayres Sensory Integration® frame of reference are taught. The implementation of an intervention plan based on the interpretation of test results is demonstrated and discussed. Clinical reasoning and case based problem solving are used throughout. The art of sensory integration therapy is taught. The participants are to **bring a case** (including SIPT & SIPT report, clinical observations, sensory questionnaires and any other information) and a 5 min video clip of a child with suspected SI difficulties during treatment.

Assessment of course work: The participants are required to submit a case and a 10 minute video clip on the treatment of a child for scoring on the Fidelity measure within the time frame as indicated at the Intervention Course. Participants need to obtain a score of 80% or higher for the Fidelity Measure process principles.

PARTICIPANTS WILL BE INFORMED OF THIS BUT IT IS THE PARTICIPANT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO KEEP UP TO DATE WITH THE LATEST INFORMATION AND TO ADHERE TO THESE REQUIREMENTS.

NOTE: REQUIREMENTS FOLLOWING A COURSE NEED TO BE COMPLETED AND SUBMITTED BY A SPECIFIC SET DATE IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND THE NEXT COURSE. THERAPISTS MUST CONTACT THE OFFICE OR CHECK ON THE WEBSITE REGARDING THE SUBMISSION DATE, ADDRESSES AND ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS BEFORE THEY SUBMIT.

Please be aware that all four courses and the submission of the video clip for scoring on the Fidelity Measure process elements need to be completed within a 5-year time span in chronological order. If this is not possible, a motivation has to be submitted and SAISI will consider which parts of the course structure need to be repeated and will set a new time frame. Upon completion of the process the therapist will receive a certificate stating that they are SI qualified, able to use the SIPT Test and can treat using ASI® principles.

FLOW CHART OF COURSE EXPECTATIONS

Theory

PRE-REQUISITES:

- AIM: 1. To make participants conversant in theory and research related to Ayres Sensory Integration ®
- 2. Discuss relationship of sensory integration to neurobiological principles and occupation.
- EQUIPMENT NEEDED: No equipment. Literature as described in reading list. Clinical observations booklets (adapted by Ayers and gross motor)
- ASSESSMENT FOLLOWING COURSE: Complete self study post course questionnaire online within the same year, and within the set time frame provided.



• PRE-REQUISITES: Attendance of a Theory Course

- AIM: 1.To provide in-depth knowledge of the process of evaluating sensory integration and praxis through the use of the Sensory integration and Praxis Test (SIPT).

• EQUIPMENT: COMPULSORY: SIPT scoring pack & SIPT Manual

- ASSESSMENT FOLLOWING COURSE: To be submitted before specified date to SAISI office

- AIM: 1. The interpretation of the SIPT scores, structured and unstructured clinical observations and patterns of dysfunction.
- EQUIPMENT: Bring case of child with suspected SI difficulties including SIPT report, clinical observations, sensory questionnaires and any other information. 5 min DVD of child during an unstructured activity

• ASSESMETN FOLLOWING COURSE:

- SIPT administration scoring pass (by mentor) proof sent with protocol

- EQUIPMENT: Bring case of child with suspected SI difficulties including SIPT & SIPT report, clinical observations, sensory questionnaires and any other information. 5 min DVD of child during treatment.

• ASSESSMENT FOLLOWING COURSE:

• Submission of a case study with a treatment DVD for assessment on process elements of the Fidelity Measure within 6 months following the course. Need to obtain a score of 80% for Fidelity Measure process elements to pass.
